#### Outcome of the conference participation

Description of the outcome of the conference presentation, including contacts made and potential for future collaborations.

The BGS Colloquium brought together some sixty participants over 4 days, and each presentation was followed by time for discussion and questions, which proved very fruitful. Following my individual presentation on the subject of the Tricolor game, a number of people provided me with information I hadn't yet been privy to, and others clearly expressed an interest in the continuation of the research in progress, especially concerning the use of AI to have a better understanding of the optimal mathematical strategies and/or the way players elaborate their own strategy.

As for the two-hour panel dedicated to presenting the Cost Action, led by Walter Crist, Eric Piette, Summer Courts and I, the exchanges were particularly rich and interesting. Around fifteen people took part in the session, asking questions both about the Cost Action in general (administrative procedures for joining the Action, participating in working groups, benefiting from the various dissemination grants, etc.), and about the issues and objectives set out in the various working groups. Concerning WG4 "mathematics in games", I was approached by Alessandro Rizzi

from the Department of Computer Science at the University of Milan – who is in charge of the project Game4Ced that combines board games and research on color blindness – to give opportunities to present the Cost Action in different events (AIC (International Color Association) Midterm Meeting in September 2024 <a href="https://aic2024.org/">https://aic2024.org/</a> where a special session is dedicated to "Colors in Games and Toys" with topics such that Design, Accessibility, Education, Professional use, Training, Storytelling, Video games, Role-playing games, Gamification or Serious games; a conference on games that will held in Milano 18th and 19th of July 2024) and to collaborate within the project Game4Ced. Game4Ced is a national granted project whose objectives are focus on (O.1) developing a board game as an educational instrument for colour blindness early detection, (O.2) increasing people's awareness of colour blindness and (O.3.) Improve inclusivity. This project belongs to the human wellbeing strategic theme since it provides new tools for teachers and educators to create a more inclusive school practice. The project is also organized in WGs (Research, Education, Dissemination) which could find overlapping with the Cost Action WGs.
